Subject: Protections Against Human Trafficking

As part of an overall effort to eradicate human and related trafficking in connection with the performance of United States government contracts, President Obama issued <u>Executive Order</u>
13.627; Strengthening Protections Against Trafficking in Persons in Federal Contracts. This Executive Order, resulted in additional requirements imposed through the Federal Acquisition Requirement (FAR) and Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (DFARS), effective in March 2015. These new requirements reflect the zero-tolerance trafficking objectives as emphasized by the U.S. government and within Boeing.

The FAR prohibits contractor and subcontractor employees working directly on federal contracts from "Prohibited Activities" as outlined within the requirements. Furthermore, The FAR Council has issued a final rule amending <u>FAR 52.222-50</u> "Combating Trafficking in Persons" (Mar 2015) requiring a compliance plan and annual certification (under certain conditions), and has added pre-award certification and compliance requirements under <u>FAR 52.222-56</u> "Certification Regarding Trafficking in Persons Compliance Plan" (Mar 2015) and <u>DFARS 252.222-7007</u> "Representation Regarding Combating Trafficking in Persons" (Jan 2015).

Recognize that there is both a pre-award and annual certification requirement when Goods (other than commercially available off-the-shelf items – COTS) / Services are acquired outside of the United States with an estimated value that exceeds \$500k.
