

Common Terms and Conditions Guide
Section 5 – Government Contract Requirements

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- (a) The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, “Contractor” and “Offeror” shall mean Seller.

52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures (JUL 1995) [excluding subparagraph (c)(1)]. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract.

52.203-8 Cancellation, Rescission, and Recovery of Funds for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 97). This clause applies to this contract if Seller, its employees, officers, directors or agents participated personally and substantially in any part of the preparation of a proposal for this contract. Seller shall indemnify Buyer for any and all losses suffered by Buyer due to violations of the Act (as set forth in this clause) by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier.

52.203-10 Price or Fee Adjustment for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. If the Government reduces Buyer’s price or fee for violations of the Act by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier, Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller the amount of the reduction.

52.203-11 Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (APR 1991)

52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (JUN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (c) (4) is modified to read as follows: “(c) (4) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Buyer) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Buyer will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller’s request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor.”

52.204-2 Security Requirements (AUG 1996) (excluding any reference to the Changes clause of this contract). This clause applies only if access to classified information is required.

52.211-5 New Materials (AUG 2000)

52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements (SEP 1990)

52.215-2 Audit and Records—Negotiation (JUN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types; (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.

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52.215-10 Price Reduction For Defective Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000. In subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a), insert "of this contract" after "price or cost." In Paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

52.215-12 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "The Boeing Company or any of its wholly owned subsidiaries."

52.215-14 Integrity of Unit Prices (OCT 1997) [excluding paragraph (b)]

52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions (DEC 1998). This clause applies only if under this contract certified cost or pricing data is required or preaward or postaward cost determinations are subject to FAR part 31. Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller such sums as the Contracting Officer withholds or recovers from Buyer because of liabilities of Seller or its subcontractors under this clause. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.215-18 Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Postretirement Benefits (PRB) Other Than Pensions (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if under this contract certified cost or pricing data is required or preaward or postaward cost determinations are subject to FAR subpart 31.2. Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller such sums as the Contracting Officer withholds or recovers from Buyer because of liabilities of Seller or its subcontractors under this clause. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.215-19 Notification of Ownership Changes (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if under this contract certified cost or pricing data is required or preaward or postaward cost determinations are subject to FAR subpart 31.2. Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller such sums as the Contracting Officer withholds or recovers from Buyer because of liabilities of Seller or its subcontractors under this clause. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (OCT 2000)

52.219-9 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (OCT 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. In paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.222-1 Notice to the Government of Labor Disputes (FEB 1997). "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

52.222-4 Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act—Overtime Compensation (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller such sums as the Contracting Officer withholds or recovers from Buyer because of liabilities of Seller or its subcontractors under this clause.

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52.222-20 Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act (DEC 1996). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (FEB 1999) [subparagraphs (b)(1) through (11)]

52.222-35 Affirmative Action for Disabled Veterans and Veterans of the Vietnam Era (APR 1998). This clause applies only if this contract is for \$10,000 or more.

52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Workers With Disabilities (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.

52.222-37 Employment Reports on Disabled Veterans and Veterans of the Vietnam ERA (JAN 1999). This clause applies only if this contract is for \$10,000 or more.

52.223-2 Clean Air and Water (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.223-3 Hazardous Material Identification and Material Safety Data (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if hazardous material will be delivered.

52.223-11 Ozone-Depleting Substances (MAY 2001)

52.225-8 Duty Free Entry (FEB 2000)

52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (JUL 1995)

52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement (AUG 1996). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer.

52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (NOV 1999). This clause applies only if clause 3050 or 3051 is incorporated in this contract. Add "Buyer and the" before "Contracting Officer" in paragraph (f).

52.244-5 Competition in Subcontracting (DEC 1996)

52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items and Commercial Components (MAY 2001)

52.245-2 Government Property (DEC 1989)

52.245-17 Special Tooling (APR 1984)

52.245-18 Special Test Equipment (FEB 1993)

52.247-63 Preference for U.S. – Flag Air Carriers (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract may involve international air transportation

52.247-64 Preference for Privately-Owned U.S. Flag Commercial Vessels (JUN 2000), Alternate I (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the small purchase limitation. Except in paragraph (c)(2) "20" and "30" are changed to 10 and 20 respectively.

52.248-1 Value Engineering (FEB 2000) [excluding subparagraph (f)]. This clause applies only if this contract is for \$100,000 or more. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. If a Value Engineering Change Proposal is accepted by the Government, Seller's share will be 50% of the instant, concurrent and future contract net acquisition savings and collateral savings that Buyer receives from the Government. Seller's negotiated share of net acquisition savings or collateral savings shall not reduce the Government's share of concurrent or future savings

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or collateral savings. Buyer's payments to Seller under this clause are conditioned upon Buyer's receipt of authorization for such payments from the Government.

- (b) The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" shall mean Seller.

252.203-7001 Prohibition on Persons Convicted of Fraud or Other Defense-Contract-Related Felonies (MAR 1999). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and is not for commercial items or components.

252.208-7000 Intent to Furnish Precious Metals as Government-Furnished Material (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if an item being purchased contains precious metals.

252.209-7000 Acquisition From Subcontractors Subject to On-Site Inspection Under the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and is not for commercial items.

252.215-7000 Pricing Adjustments (DEC 1991)

252.223-7001 Hazard Warning Labels (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.

252.223-7002 Safety Precautions for Ammunition and Explosives (MAY 1994). This clause applies only if this contract involves ammunition or explosives.

252.225-7002 Qualifying Country Sources as Subcontractors (DEC 1991)

252.225-7009 Duty-Free Entry – Qualifying Country Supplies (End Products and Supplies) (AUG 2000)

252.225-7010 Duty-Free Entry—Additional Provisions (AUG 2000). This clause applies if FAR 52.225-10 applies. Additional information referenced in this clause is available on request.

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (AUG 2000)

252.225-7014 Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals (MAR 1998), Alternate I (MAR 1998)

252.225-7016 Restriction on Acquisition of Ball and Roller Bearings (DEC 2000). This clause applies unless this contract is for (1) commercial items other than ball or roller bearings or (2) items that do not contain ball or roller bearings.

252.225-7022 Restriction on Acquisition of Polyacrylonitrile (PAN) Based Carbon Fiber (JUN 1997)

252.225-7025 Restriction on Acquisition of Forgings (JUN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract is for goods that contain restricted forging items per paragraphs (a) and (b) of the referenced clause.

252.225-7026 Reporting of Contract Performance Outside the United States (JUN 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and is

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not for commercial items, construction, ores, natural gases, utilities, petroleum products and crudes, timber (logs), or subsistence.

252.227-7013 Rights in Technical Data—Noncommercial Items (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if this contract requires Seller to provide noncommercial technical data to Buyer for delivery to the Government.

252.227-7019 Validation of Asserted Restrictions – Computer Software (JUN 1995)

252.227-7026 Deferred Delivery of Technical Data or Computer Software (APR 1988). This clause applies only if technical data or computer software may be originated, developed, or delivered under this contract.

252.227-7027 Deferred Ordering of Technical Data or Computer Software (APR 1988). This clause applies only if technical data or computer software may be generated as part of the performance of this contract.

252.227-7030 Technical Data - Withholding of Payment (MAR 2000). In this clause, “Government” and “Contracting Officer” shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 1999). This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract and the contract is not for commercial items or commercial components.

252.231-7000 Supplemental Cost Principles (DEC 1991)

252.235-7003 Frequency Authorization (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract involves the development, production, construction, testing, or operation of a device for which a radio frequency authorization is required.

252.245-7001 Reports of Government Property (MAY 1994). Seller will provide information Buyer may require to complete Buyer’s annual report.

252.246-7001 Warranty of Data (DEC 1991). In this clause, “Government” and “Contracting Officer” shall mean Buyer. The warranty period in paragraph (b) is three years from the Government’s acceptance of the final items of data.

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). “Contracting Officer” and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), “Contractor” mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in

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humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

(c) Government-Industry Data Exchange Program (GIDEP)

(1) If the negotiated amount of an order under this Basic Ordering Agreement exceeds \$500,000, the contractor shall provide and maintain procedures to enable his full participation in the appropriate interchange of the Government-Industry Data Exchange Program (GIDEP) in accordance with the issue of MIL-STD-1556 in effect on the date of the order. Compliance with this clause shall not relieve the contractor from complying with any other provision to the contract.

(2) When this clause is applicable to an order, the contractor agrees to insert paragraph (a) above in any subcontract thereunder exceeding \$500,000. When so inserted, the word "Contractor" shall be changed to "Subcontractor."
