**CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS**

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

**1. FAR Clauses** The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

**52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government** (SEP 2006). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold.

**52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures** (OCT 2010). Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$150,000.

**52.203-8 Cancellation, Rescission, and Recovery of Funds for Illegal or Improper Activity** (JAN 1997). This clause applies to this contract if the Seller, its employees, officers, directors or agents participated personally and substantially in any part of the preparation of a proposal for this contract. The Seller shall indemnify Buyer for any and all losses suffered by the Buyer due to violations of the Act (as set forth in this clause) by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier.

**52.203-10 Price or Fee Adjustment for Illegal or Improper Activity** (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold. If the Government reduces Buyer's price or fee for violations of the Act by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier, Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of the reduction.

**52.203-11 Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions** (SEP 2007). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold.

**52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$150,000. Paragraph (g)(2) is modified to read as follows: "(g)(2) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor."

**52.209-6 Protecting the Government's Interests When Subcontracting With Contractors Debarred, Suspended or Proposed for Debarment** (DEC 2010). Seller agrees it is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. Seller shall disclose to Buyer, in writing, whether as of the time of award of this contract, Seller or its principals is or is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government.

**52.211-5 Material Requirements** (AUG 2000). Any notice will be given to Buyer rather than the Contracting Officer.

**52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements** (APR 2008). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.

**52.215-2 Audit and Records - Negotiation** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$150,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types; (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.

**52.215-11 Price Reduction for Defective Cost or Pricing Data -- Modifications** (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In subparagraph (d)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" means "Government" or "Buyer." In Paragraph (e), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

**52.215-12 Subcontractor Certified Cost or Pricing Data** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "to The Boeing Company or The Boeing Company's representative (including data submitted, when applicable, to an authorized representative of the U.S. Government)."

**52.215-14 Integrity of Unit Prices** (OCT 2010). This clause applies except for contracts at or below \$150,000; construction or architect-engineer services under FAR Part 36; utility services under FAR Part 41; services where supplies are not required; commercial items; and petroleum products.

**52.215-14 Integrity of Unit Prices Alternate I** (OCT 1997).

**52.215-15 Pension Adjustments and Asset Reversions** (OCT 2010). This clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(g).

**52.215-18 Reversion or Adjustment of Plans for Post-Retirement Benefits (PRB) Other Than Pensions** (JUL 2005). This clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(j).

**52.215-19 Notification of Ownership Changes** (OCT 1997). This clause applies to this contract if it meets the requirements of FAR 15.408(k).

**52.215-21 Requirement for Certified Cost or Pricing Data or Information Other Than Certified Cost and Pricing Data - Modifications** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns** (DEC 2010). Required in solicitations and contracts exceeding the simplified acquisition threshold.

**52.219-9 Small-Business Subcontracting Plan** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$650,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. Seller shall adopt a subcontracting plan that complies with the requirements of this clause. In addition, Seller shall submit to Buyer Form X31162, Small and Small Disadvantaged Business and Women-Owned Small Business Subcontracting Plan Certificate of Compliance. In accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(iv), Seller agrees that it will submit the ISR and/or SSR using eSRS, and, in accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(vi), Seller agrees to provide the prime contract number, its own DUNS number, and the email address of Seller's official responsible for acknowledging or rejecting the ISRs, to its subcontractors with subcontracting plans.

**52.222-1 Notice to the Government of Labor Disputes** (FEB 1997). Contracting Officer shall mean Buyer.

**52.222-4 Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act-Overtime Compensation** (JUL 2005). Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller the amount of any sums the Contracting Officer withholds or recovers from Buyer because of liabilities of Seller or its subcontractors under this clause.

**52.222-20 Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

**52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities** (FEB 1999).

**52.222-26 Equal Opportunity** (MAR 2007).

**52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Veterans.** (SEP 2010). This clause applies only if this contract is \$100,000 or more.

**52.222-36 Affirmative Action For Workers With Disabilities** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

**52.222-37 Employment Reports on Veterans** (SEP 2010). This clause applies if this contract is \$100,000 or more.

**52.222-41 Service Contract Act of 1965** (NOV 2007). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the Act.

**52.223-3 Hazardous Material Identification and Material Safety Data** (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.

**52.223-13 Certification of Toxic Chemical Release Reporting** (AUG 2003). Except for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, this clause applies to competitive procurements expected to exceed \$100,000 (including all options). If Seller is not subject to the Form R filing and reporting requirements, Seller shall inform Buyer which exemption or exemptions in subparagraph (b)(2) of this clause apply.

**52.223-14 Toxic Chemical Release Reporting** (OCT 1996). This clause applies only if this contract is not for commercial items as defined in FAR Part 2, was competitively awarded, and exceeds \$100,000 (including all options).

**52.225-8 Duty-Free Entry** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract identifies supplies to be afforded duty-free entry or if foreign supplies in excess of \$15,000 may be imported into the customs territory of the United States. For the purposes of this clause, the blanks in paragraph (g)(3) are completed as follows: UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, Duty-free entry is claimed pursuant Section XXII, Chapter 98, Subchapter VIII, Item No. 9808.00.30 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States. Upon arrival of shipment at port of entry, the importer or authorized agent will notify Commander, Defense Contract Management Area Operations (DCMAO, New York, 201 Varick Street, New York, New York, 10014-4811, Attention DCRN-NCT) for execution of Customs Forms 7501, 7501-A, or 7506 and required duty free entry certificates.

**52.225-13 Restriction on Certain Foreign Purchases** (JUN 2008).

**52.227-1 Authorization and Consent Basic (JUL 1995), Alternate I (APR 1984)** .

**52.227-1 Authorization and Consent Alternate II** (APR 1984).

**52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement** (DEC 2007). A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer.

**52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement** (AUG 1996). A copy of each notice sent to the

Government will be sent to Buyer. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer". This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

**52.227-9 Refund of Royalties** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if the amount of royalties reported during negotiation of this contract exceeds \$250.

**52.227-10 Filing of Patent Applications - Classified Subject Matter** (DEC 2007).

**52.227-10 Filing of Patent Applications - Classified Subject Matter** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract will involve access to classified information.

**52.227-11 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Short Form)** (JUN 1997). This clause only applies if this Contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

**52.227-11 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Short Form) Alternate I** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-11 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Short Form) Alternate II** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-11 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Short Form) Alternate III** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-11 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Short Form) Alternate IV** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-12 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Long Form)** (JAN 1997). This clause only applies if this Contract is for experimental, developmental, or research work and Seller is other than a small business firm or nonprofit organization.

**52.227-12 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Long Form) Alternate I** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-12 Patent Rights-Retention by the Contractor (Long Form) Alternate II** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-13 Patent Rights-Acquisition by the Government Alternate I** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-13 Patent Rights-Acquisition by the Government Alternate II** (JUN 1989).

**52.227-14 Rights in Data--General Basic (JUN 1987), Alternate II (JUN 1987), Alternate III (JUN 1987)** . This clause applies only if data will be produced, furnished or acquired under this contract.

**52.227-14 Rights in Data--General Alternate I** (JUN 1987).

**52.227-14 Rights in Data--General Alternate IV** (JUN 1987).

**52.227-14 Rights in Data--General Alternate V** (JUN 1987).

**52.227-16 Additional Data Requirements** (JUN 1987). This clause applies only if this contract involves experimental, developmental, research, or demonstration work.

**52.227-17 Rights in Data-Special Works** (JUN 1987).

**52.227-18 Rights in Data-Existing Works** (JUN 1987). In paragraph (b), "Government" means the Government and the Buyer.

**52.227-19 Commercial Computer Software - Restricted Rights** (JUN 1987).

**52.227-20 Rights in Data-Small Business Innovation Research Program** (MAR 1994).

**52.227-21 Technical Data Declaration, Revision, and Withholding of Payments-Major Systems** (JAN 1997).

**52.227-22 Major System-Minimum Rights** (JUN 1987).

**52.228-5 Insurance - Work on a Government Installation** (JAN 1997). Seller shall provide and maintain insurance as set forth in this contract.

**52.229-10 State of New Mexico Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax** (APR 2003). This clause applies only if (1) this contract is a cost-reimbursement contract; (2) this contract directs or authorizes Seller to acquire tangible personal property as a direct cost under a contract and title to such property passes directly to and vests in the United States upon delivery of the property by the subcontractor, and (3) this contract is for services to be performed in whole or in part in the State of New Mexico..

**52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards** (JUN 2010). Add "Buyer and the" before "CFAO" in paragraph (m). This clause applies if clause H001, H002, H004 or H007 is included in this contract.

**52.234-1 Industrial Resources Developed Under Defense Production Act Title III** (DEC 1994).

**52.237-2 Protection of Government Buildings, Equipment, and Vegetation** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if work will be performed on a Government installation. "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

**52.242-15 Stop-Work Order Alternate I** (APR 1984). Change "90 days" and "30 days" to "100 days" and "20 days" respectively. The terms "Contracting Officer" and "Government" shall mean Buyer. In the first sentence of Alternate I, "the Termination clause of this contract" is modified to read "the Termination/Cancellation clause of this contract."

**52.244-5 Competition in Subcontracting** (DEC 1996).

**52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items** (DEC 2010). Clauses in paragraph (c) (1) are applicable to Seller for commercial items ordered by Buyer from Seller under this contract.

**52.245-2 Government Property (Fixed Price Contracts)** (DEC 1989). This clause is not applicable if this contract incorporates Form GP4. "Government" shall mean Government throughout except the first time it appears in paragraph (f) when "Government" shall mean the Government or the Buyer..

**52.245-5 Government Property (Cost-Reimbursement, Time-and-Material, or Labor-Hour Contracts)** (MAY 2004).

**GOVERNMENT-OWNED PROPERTY.**

FAR 52.245-5 (May 2004), "Government Property (Cost Reimbursement, Time-and-Material, or Labor-Hour Contracts)," is incorporated by reference. "Contractor" means "Seller," "Government" means "Government and/or "Buyer" (except that references to "Government property" or "Government-furnished property" shall not mean Buyer's property), "Contracting Officer" means "Contracting Officer" and/or "Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative," and paragraph (g) is revised to read as follows:

"(g) Risk of Loss. Seller, upon the delivery to it or acquisition by it of any Government property, assumes the risk of and shall be responsible for all loss thereof or damage thereto. When such property is no longer needed for the performance of this contract, or at such other time as may be directed by Buyer pursuant to paragraph (i) of this article, Seller shall return such property to Buyer or the Government, as applicable, in as good condition as when received, except for reasonable wear and tear, and except for such property as has been reasonably consumed in the performance of work hereunder."

Applicable clause date is revised to JAN 1986.

**52.245-17 Special Tooling Alternate I** (APR 1984). This clause applies only if tooling is acquired for or furnished by the Government and to be retained for use by the Seller.

**52.245-18 Special Test Equipment** (FEB 1993). Change "30 days" to "45 days" in paragraph (b) and (c). The notice of intent to procure special test equipment required by this clause shall be forwarded to the Buyer.

**52.247-63 Preference for U.S.-Flag Air Carriers** (JUN 2003). This clause only applies if this contract involves international air transportation.

**52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels** (FEB 2006). This clause does not apply if this contract is for the acquisition of commercial items unless (i) this contract is a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) items the Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Seller does not add value to the items when it subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b) shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.

**52.247-67 Submission of Commercial Transportation Bills to the General Services Administration for Audit** (JUN 1997).

**2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses** DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

**252.203-7001 Prohibition on Persons Convicted of Fraud or Other Defense-Contract-Related Felonies** (DEC 2008).

This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold and is not for the purchase of commercial items or commercial components. Except in paragraph (a), "this contract" and "the contract" mean the contract between Buyer and Seller. In subparagraph (d)(2), delete the words "or first-tier subcontractor." In paragraph (e), the remedies described in subparagraphs (2) and (3) are available to Buyer, not the Government. In paragraph (f), "through the Buyer" is inserted after "Contracting Officer." Paragraph (g) is deleted.

**252.204-7000 Disclosure of Information** (DEC 1991). Seller will submit requests for authorization to release through Buyer. Seller shall submit written requests to Buyer a minimum of 60 days prior to proposed date of release.

**252.209-7000 Acquisition From Subcontractors Subject to On-site Inspection Under the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty** (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and does not apply to the purchase of commercial items or commercial components.

**252.211-7000 Acquisition Streamlining** (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$1.5 million.

**252.215-7000 Pricing Adjustments** (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds the threshold set forth in FAR 15.403-4.

**252.219-7003 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts)** (OCT 2010). Except paragraph (g) which is hereby deleted.

**252.223-7001 Hazard Warning Labels** (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if Seller delivers hazardous material under this contract.

**252.223-7002 Safety Precautions for Ammunition and Explosives** (MAY 1994). This clause applies only if this contract involves

ammunition or explosives. "Government" means Government or Buyer in paragraph (b)(2), each time it appears in (e), (f)(1), (f)(2), the first time it appears in (g)(1)(i), and in (g)(3). "Government" means Buyer in paragraphs (c)(3), (c)(4), (c)(5), and the second time it appears in (g)(1)(i). "Contracting Officer" means Contracting Officer and Buyer in paragraph (g)(4). "Contracting Officer" means Buyer in paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(2), (c)(3), (c)(4), (c)(5), and each time it appears in (d).

**252.223-7003 Change in Place of Performance-Ammunition and Explosives** (DEC 1991). This clause applies only if DFARS 252.223-7002 is applicable to this contract. The term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer.

**252.223-7006 Prohibition on Storage and Disposal of Toxic and Hazardous Materials** (APR 1993).

**252.223-7007 Safeguarding Sensitive Conventional Arms, Ammunition, and Explosives** (SEP 1999). This clause applies only if (1) this contract, or a subcontract at any tier, is for the development, production, manufacture, or purchase of arms, ammunition, and explosives (AA&E) or (2) AA&E will be provided to Seller, or to a subcontractor at any tier, as Government-furnished property. "Arms, ammunition, and explosives (AA&E)" means those items within the scope (chapter 1, paragraph B) of DoD 5100.76-M, Physical Security of Sensitive Conventional Arms, Ammunition, and Explosives.

**252.225-7008 Restriction on Acquisition of Specialty Metals** (JUL 2009). This clause applies if the contract exceeds \$150,000.

**252.225-7009 Restriction on Acquisition of Certain Articles Containing Specialty Metals (10 U. S. C. 2533b)** .

**252.225-7010 Duty-free Entry - Additional Provisions** (AUG 2000). This clause applies in addition to FAR 52.225-10.

**252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities** (JUN 2010).

**252.225-7014 Preference for Domestic Specialty Metals, Alternate I (10 U.S.C. 2241 note)** .

**252.225-7016 Restriction on Acquisition of Ball and Roller Bearings** (DEC 2010). This clause does not apply to the purchase of commercial items other than ball or roller bearings or to items which contain no ball or roller bearings.

**252.225-7022 Restriction on Acquisition of Polyacrylonitrile (PAN) Carbon Fiber** (JUN 2005). Contracting Officer means Buyer. This clause applies only if the product furnished under this contract contains polyacrylonitrile carbon fibers (alternatively referred to as PAN-based carbon fibers or PAN-based graphite fibers).

**252.225-7024 Restriction on Night Vision Intensifier Tubes and Devices** (DEC 1991).

**252.225-7025 Restriction on Acquisition of Forgings** (DEC 2009). This clause applies only if this contract is for goods that contain restricted forging items per paragraphs (a) and (b) of the referenced clause.

**252.225-7026 Reporting of Contract Performance Outside the United States** (JUN 2000). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000 and is not for commercial items, construction, ores, natural gases, utilities, petroleum products and crudes, timber (logs), or subsistence.

**252.227-7013 Rights In Technical Data -- Noncommercial Items** (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for noncommercial items under this contract.

**252.227-7013 Rights In Technical Data -- Noncommercial Items Alternate I** (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for noncommercial items under this contract.

**252.227-7014 Rights In Noncommercial Computer Software And Noncommercial Computer Software Documentation Basic**

**(JUN 1995), Alternate I (JUN 1995)**. This clause applies only if the delivery of noncommercial computer software or noncommercial computer documentation may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

**252.227-7015 Technical Data -- Commercial Items** (NOV 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required for commercial items under this contract.

**252.227-7016 Rights in Bid or Proposal Information** (JAN 2011). Applicable clause date is revised to JUN 1995.

**252.227-7016 Rights in Bid or Proposal Information** (JUN 1995).

**252.227-7017 Identification and Assertion of Use, Release, or Disclosure Restrictions** (JAN 2011). Applicable clause date is revised to JUN 1995.

**252.227-7017 Identification and Assertion of Use, Release, or Disclosure Restrictions** (JUN 1995).

**252.227-7018 Rights in Noncommercial Technical Data and Computer Software -- Small Business Innovative Research (SBIR) Program** (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if the delivery of noncommercial technical data or computer software to the Government is required under Buyer's prime contract.

**252.227-7019 Validation of Asserted Restrictions - Computer Software** (JUN 1995). This clause applies only if computer software may be originated, developed, or delivered under this contract.

**252.227-7026 Deferred Delivery of Technical Data or Computer Software** (APR 1988). This clause applies only if the delivery of data is required or if computer software may be originated, developed or delivered under this contract.

**252.227-7027 Deferred Ordering of Technical Data or Computer Software** (APR 1988). This clause applies only if technical data or computer software may be generated as part of the performance of this contract.

**252.227-7030 Technical Data - Withholding of Payment** (OCT 1988). In this clause, "Government" and "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

**252.227-7036 Certification of Technical Data Conformity** (MAY 1987). This clause applies only if the delivery of technical data is required under this contract.

- (d) The Air Force has reviewed the requirements specified in this contract to reflect this policy. Where considered essential, specific approval has been obtained to require use of the following substances: Substance Application Use Quantity (lbs.) None(e) To assist the Air Force in implementing this policy, the offeror/contractor is required to notify the contracting officer if any Class I ODS not specifically listed above is required in the performance of this contract.
