CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

The following customer contract requirements apply to this contract to the extent indicated below. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items under a Government prime contract, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

1. FAR Clauses The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (SEP 2006). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds (i) \$100,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP or customer contract issued before October 1, 2010 or (ii) \$150,000 if included in Buyer's customer RFP issued on or after October 1, 2010, or if the prime contract was issued prior to October 1, 2010 but was amended after October 1, 2010 to increase the Simplified Acquisition Threshold.

52.203-13 Contractor Code of Business Ethics and Conduct (OCT 2015). This clause applies only if this contract is in excess of \$5,500,000 and has a period of performance of more than 120 days.

52.203-15 Whistleblower Protections Under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (JUN 2010). This clause applies if this contract is funded in whole or in part with Recovery Act funds.

52.204-7 System for Award Management (OCT 2016).

52.204-9 Personal Identity Verification of Contractor Personnel. (JAN 2011). This clause applies only if performance under this contract requires Seller to have routine physical access to a Federally-controlled facility and/or routine access to a Federally-controlled information system.

52.204-11 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act--Reporting (JUL 2010). If this contract is in excess of \$25,000, Seller is not an individual, and in the previous tax year, Seller had gross income of \$300,000 or more, Seller shall promptly upon receipt of the contract provide Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative the information described in subparagraphs (i), (ix), (x), (xi), and (xii) of paragraph (d) (10) of FAR 52.204-11. Buyer advises Seller that the information will be made available to the public as required by section 1512 of the Recovery Act.

52.204-14 Service Contract Reporting Requirements (OCT 2016). In this clause, "Contractor" means "Buyer." Seller shall submit the information required by paragraph (f) (1) for services performed under this contract at or above the thresholds set forth in 4.1703(a)(2), during the preceding fiscal year (October 1-Sept 30) to Buyer annually by Oct. 15th. In accordance with paragraph (f) (2), this information will be made available to the public as required by section 743 of Division C of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2010.

52.204-15 Service Contract Reporting Requirements for Indefinite-Delivery Contracts (OCT 2016). In this clause, "Contractor" means "Buyer." Seller shall submit the information required by paragraph (f) (1) for services performed under this contract at or above the thresholds set forth in 4.1703(a)(2), during the preceding fiscal year (October 1-Sept 30) to Buyer annually by Oct. 15th. In accordance with paragraph (f) (2), this information will be made available to the public as required by section 743 of Division C of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2010.

52.209-6 Protecting the Government's Interests When Subcontracting With Contractors Debarred, Suspended or Proposed for Debarment (OCT 2015). Seller agrees it is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. Seller shall disclose to Buyer, in writing, whether as of the time of award of this contract, Seller or its principals is or is not debarred,

suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. This clause does not apply to contracts where Seller is providing commercially available off-the shelf items.

52.212-4 Contract Terms and Conditions-Commercial Items (MAY 2015). Only paragraph (u) of this clause applies.

52.212-5 Contract Terms and Conditions Required to Implement Statutes or Executive Orders-Commercial Items (NOV 2016). The clauses listed in (e) (1) are included in this contract.

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (NOV 2016).

52.219-9 Small-Business Subcontracting Plan (JAN 2017). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$700,000 and Seller is not a small business concern. Seller shall adopt a subcontracting plan that complies with the requirements of this clause. In addition, Seller shall submit to Buyer Form X31162, Small Business Subcontracting Plan Certificate of Compliance. In accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(iv), Seller agrees that it will submit the ISR and/or SSR using eSRS, and, in accordance with paragraph (d)(10)(vi), Seller agrees to provide the prime contract number, its own DUNS number, and the email address of Seller's official responsible for acknowledging or rejecting the ISRs, to its subcontractors with subcontracting plans.

52.219-28 Post-Award Small Business Program Representation (JUL 2013). In paragraph (b), delete "...or, if applicable paragraph (g) of this clause..." Delete paragraph (c) and insert the following paragraph (c) in lieu thereof: "Seller shall represent its size status in accordance with SBA's size code standards in effect at the time of this representation to Buyer. The size status shall correspond to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code applicable to Seller's contract." Delete paragraphs (d) and (g). Delete paragraph (e) and insert the following paragraph (e) in lieu thereof: "Seller shall make the representation required by paragraph (b) of this clause by submitting an updated Buyer Form F70102 or updating Seller's profile information on line in Buyer's BEST system."

52.222-17 Nondisplacement of Qualified Workers (MAY 2014). The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer" in paragraph (d)(1). In paragraph (d)(1), "30 days" is changed to "40 days" and "10 days" is changed to "15 days."

52.222-18 Certification Regarding Knowledge of Child Labor for Listed End Products (FEB 2001). In (c), "Government" means Buyer.

52.222-19 Child Labor - Cooperation with Authorities and Remedies (OCT 2016). In (d), "Contracting Officer" means Buyer.

52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (APR 2015).

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (SEP 2016).

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b)(1) through (11)) Alternate I (FEB 1999).

52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Veterans. (OCT 2015). This clause applies only if this contract is \$150,000 or more.

52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans Alternate I (JUL 2014).

52.222-36 Equal Opportunity for Workers with Disabilities (JUL 2014). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

52.222-37 Employment Reports on Veterans (FEB 2016). This clause applies if this contract is \$150,000 or more, unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor.

52.222-40 Notification of Employee Rights Under the National Labor Relations Act. (DEC 2010).

52.222-41 Service Contract Labor Standards (MAY 2014). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the Act. Where

applicable, Wage Determination(s) shall be attached to the purchase contract at the time of award, or furnished upon request.

52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons (MAR 2015). The term “contractor” shall mean “Seller”, except in the paragraph (a) definition of Agent, and except when the term “prime contractor” appears, which shall remain unchanged. The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer, Buyer's Authorized Procurement representative” in paragraph (d)(1). Paragraph (d)(2) shall read as follows: “If the allegation may be associated with more than one contract, the Seller shall inform the Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative for each affected contract.” The term “the Government” shall mean “the Government and Buyer” in paragraph (e). The term “termination” shall mean “Cancellation” and “Cancellation for Default”, respectively, in paragraph (e)(6). The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer and Buyer” in paragraph (f), except in paragraph (f)(2), where it shall mean “Contracting Officer or Buyer”. Paragraph (h)(2)(ii) shall read as follows: “To the nature and scope of the activities involved in the performance of a Government subcontract, including the number of non-United States citizens expected to be employed and the risk that the contract or subcontract will involve services or supplies susceptible to trafficking in persons.” The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer or Buyer” in paragraph (h)(4)(ii). The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Buyer” in paragraph (h)(5).

52.222-51 Exemption from Application of the Service Contract Labor Standards to Contracts for Maintenance, Calibration, or Repair of Certain Equipment--Requirements (MAY 2014). This clause applies only for exempt services under this Contract. Seller shall provide the certification contained in FAR 52.222-48 Exemption from Application of Service Contract Labor Standards to Contracts for Maintenance, Calibration, or Repair of Certain Equipment—Certification, paragraph (a) to Buyer should Seller intend to rely on 52.222-51.

52.222-53 Exemption From Application Of The Service Contract Labor Standards To Contracts For Certain Services-Requirements (MAY 2014). This clause applies to contracts for exempt services.

52.222-54 Employment Eligibility Verification (OCT 2015). This clause applies to all subcontracts that (1) are for (i) commercial or noncommercial services (except for commercial services that are part of the purchase of a COTS item, or an item that would be a COTS item, but for minor modifications performed by the COTS provider and are normally provided for that COTS item), or (ii) construction; (2) has a value of more than \$3,500; and (3) includes work performed in the United States.

52.222-55 Minimum Wages Under Executive Order 13658 (DEC 2015). This clause applies if this contract is subject to the Service Contract Labor Standards statute or the Wage Rate Requirements (Construction) statute, and is to be performed in whole or in part in the United States. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer" except for paragraphs (e)(2), (4) and (g). If the Government exercises a withhold identified in the paragraph (g) against Buyer as a result of the Seller's violation of its obligations under this clause, Buyer may impose that withhold against the Seller.

52.223-11 Ozone-Depleting Substances and High Global Warming Potential Hydrofluorocarbons (JUN 2016). Seller shall submit the information required by paragraph (c) (1) annually to Buyer by October 15th during each year of contract performance, and at the end of contract performance.

52.223-12 Maintenance, Service, Repair, or Disposal of Refrigeration Equipment and Air Conditioners. (JUN 2016). Seller shall submit the information required by paragraph (d)(1) to Buyer no later than October 15th of each year during contract performance, and at the end of contract performance.

52.223-15 Energy Efficiency In Energy-Consuming Products (DEC 2007).

52.223-18 Encouraging Contractor Policies To Ban Text Messaging While Driving (AUG 2011).

52.225-1 Buy American - Supplies (MAY 2014). The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer the first time it is used in paragraph (c). In paragraph (d), the phrase "in the provision of the solicitation entitled 'Buy American Certificate' is deleted and replaced with "in its offer."

52.225-3 Buy American Act-Free Trade Agreements-Israeli-Trade Act (MAY 2014). “Contracting Officer” means Buyer in paragraph (b). In paragraph (c), the phrase "in the provision entitled 'Buy American Act--Free Trade Agreements--Israeli Trade Act Certificate'" is deleted.

52.225-5 Trade Agreements (OCT 2016). In paragraph (b), the phrase "in the provision entitled 'Trade Agreement Certificate' " is deleted.

52.225-8 Duty-Free Entry (OCT 2010). This clause applies only if this contract identifies supplies to be afforded duty-free entry or if foreign supplies in excess of \$15,000 may be imported into the customs territory of the United States. For the purposes of this clause, the blanks in paragraph (g)(3) are completed as follows: UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, Duty-free entry is claimed pursuant Section XXII, Chapter 98, Subchapter VIII, Item No. 9808.00.30 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States. Upon arrival of shipment at port of entry, the importer or authorized agent will notify Commander, Defense Contract Management Area Operations (DCMAO, New York, 201 Varick Street, New York, New York, 10014-4811, Attention DCRN-NCT) for execution of Customs Forms 7501, 7501-A, or 7506 and required duty free entry certificates.

52.225-13 Restriction on Certain Foreign Purchases (JUN 2008).

52.225-19 Contractor Personnel in a Designated Operational Area or Supporting a Diplomatic or Consular Mission Outside the United States. (MAR 2008). This clause is applicable when Seller personnel performs work outside the United States in: (1) In a designated operational area during (i) Contingency operations; (ii) Humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) Other military operations; or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander; or; (2) When supporting a diplomatic or consular mission (i) That has been designated by the Department of State as a danger pay post See http://aoprals.state.gov/Web920/danger_pay_all.asp and (ii) That the Contracting Officer has indicated is subject to this clause.

52.225-26 Contractors Performing Private Security Functions Outside the United States (OCT 2016). This clause applies if the Contract will be performed outside the United States in areas of (1) combat operations, as designated by the Secretary of Defense; or (2) other significant military operations, upon agreement of the Secretaries of Defense and State that the clause applies in that area. In paragraph (d)(1), Contracting Officer shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer" and in paragraph (d) (3), Contracting Officer shall mean Buyer.

52.226-6 Promoting Excess Food Donation to Nonprofit Organizations. (MAY 2014). This clause applies if this contract is in excess of \$25,000 and Seller will perform the provision, service, or sale of food in the United States under this contract.

52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (JUN 2010). Add "Buyer and the" before "CFAO" in paragraph (m). This clause applies if clause H001, H002, H004 or H007 is included in this contract.

52.234-4 Earned Value Management System (NOV 2016). This clause applies to those subcontractors specified elsewhere in this contract. In (b) (2) "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. In (c) Government means Buyer and "may" is substituted for "will." In (d) "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. In (e) delete the last two sentences. Seller agrees to notify Buyer in writing when a waiver or change is approved by the CFA. In (f) "Contracting Officer" means Contracting Officer or Buyer and Government means Government or Buyer.

52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (NOV 2016). Clauses in paragraph (c) (1) are applicable to Seller for commercial items ordered by Buyer from Seller under this contract.

52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels (FEB 2006). This clause does not apply if this contract is for the acquisition of commercial items unless (i) this contract is a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) items the Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Seller does not add value to the items when it subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b) shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.

2. DoD FAR Supplement Clauses DoD Contracts. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Department of Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller except as otherwise noted.

252.203-7002 REQUIREMENT TO INFORM EMPLOYEES OF WHISTLEBLOWER RIGHTS (SEP 2013).

252.203-7003 Agency Office of the Inspector General. (DEC 2012). This clause applies if FAR 52.203-13 applies.

252.204-7010 Requirement for Contractor to Notify DoD if the Contractor's Activities are Subject to Reporting Under the U.S. - International Atomic Energy Agency Additional Protocol. (JAN 2009). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the provisions of U.S.-International Atomic Energy Agency Additional Protocol.

252.211-7003 Item Unique Identification and Valuation (MAR 2016). This clause applies if this contract acquires any item for which unique item identification is required in accordance with paragraph (c) (1) of this clause. Any exceptions under paragraph (c) (1) (i) or specific items requiring a unique item identifier in accordance with paragraph (c) (1) (ii)-(v), if any, shall be identified in an exhibit in this contract.

252.211-7006 Radio Frequency Identification (JUN 2016). This clause applies when the Seller will make direct shipments of items meeting the criteria at 211.275-2 to the Government.

252.219-7003 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (DoD Contracts) (MAR 2016). Paragraph (e) is deleted.

252.219-7004 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (Test Program) (OCT 2014). This clause applies if Seller participates in the test program described in DFARS 219.702.

252.225-7001 Buy American and Balance of Payments Program (AUG 2016). In paragraph (c), the phrase "in the Buy American Balance of Payments Program Certificate provision of the solicitation" is deleted and the word "certified" is deleted and replaced with the word "specified."

252.225-7008 Restriction on Acquisition of Specialty Metals (MAR 2013). This clause applies if the contract exceeds \$150,000.

252.225-7009 Restriction on Acquisition of Certain Articles Containing Specialty Metals (OCT 2014). Paragraphs (d) and (e) (1) of this clause are excluded. In paragraph (e)(2) "Government" means Buyer. Paragraph (c)(6) is revised as follows:
(c)(6) End items of the prime contract containing a minimal amount of otherwise noncompliant specialty metals (*i.e.*, specialty metals not melted or produced in the United States, an outlying area, or a qualifying country, that are not covered by one of the other exceptions in this paragraph (c)), if the total weight of such noncompliant metals does not exceed 2 percent of the total weight of all specialty metals in that end item,

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (AUG 2016).

252.225-7015 Restriction on Acquisition of Hand or Measuring Tools (JUN 2005).

252.225-7021 Trade Agreements (SEP 2016). In paragraph (c) (1), the phrase "in the Trade Agreements Certificate provision of the solicitation" is deleted.

252.225-7028 Exclusionary Policies and Practices of Foreign Governments (APR 2003).

252.225-7035 Buy American-Free Trade Agreements-Balance of Payments Program Certificate-Alternate I Alternate I (NOV 2014).

252.225-7036 Buy American-Free Trade Agreements-Balance of Payments (AUG 2016). In paragraph (c), the phrase "in the Buy American-Free Trade Agreements-Balance of Payments Program Certificate-Basic provision of the solicitation" is deleted, and the word "certified" is deleted and replaced with the word "specified."

252.225-7038 Restriction on Acquisition of Air Circuit Breakers (JUN 2005).

252.225-7039 Defense Contractors Performing Private Security Functions Outside the United States (JUN 2016). This clause applies if the contract requires that private security functions will be performed outside the United States in areas of (1) contingency operations; (2) combat operations, as designated by the Secretary of Defense; (3) other significant military operations (as defined in 32 CFR part 159), designated by the Secretary of Defense upon agreement of the Secretary of State; (4) peace operations, consistent with Joint Publication 3-07.3; or (5) other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander.

252.225-7040 Contractor Personnel Supporting U.S. Armed Forces Deployed Outside the United States (OCT 2015). This clause, including this paragraph (q), applies if, in performance of this contract, Seller personnel are supporting U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States in (1) contingency operations; (2) peace operations consistent with Joint Publication 3-07.3; or (3) other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander or as directed by the Secretary of Defense.

252.225-7043 Antiterrorism/Force Protection Policy for Defense Contractors Outside the United States (JUN 2015). This clause applies only if this contract requires Seller to perform or travel outside the United States and Seller is not (1) a foreign government, (2) a representative of a foreign government, or (3) a foreign corporation wholly owned by a foreign government.

252.227-7015 Technical Data -- Commercial Items (FEB 2014). This clause applies whenever any technical data related to commercial items is developed in any part at private expense and will be obtained from Seller or its subcontractors for delivery to the Government.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 2016).

252.235-7002 Animal Welfare (DEC 2014). This clause only applies if this contract involves research, development, test, and evaluation or training that use live vertebrate animals. In paragraph (d) Contracting Officer means Buyer.

252.236-7013 Requirement for Competition Opportunity for American Steel Producers, Fabricators, and Manufacturers (JUN 2013). This clause applies if this contract involves the acquisition of steel as a construction material.

252.237-7010 Prohibition on Interrogation of Detainees by Contractor Personnel (JUN 2013). This clause applies if the contract requires Seller's personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

252.237-7019 Training for Contractor Personnel Interacting with Detainees (JUN 2013). This clause applies if the Contract may require Seller personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

252.237-7023 Continuation of Essential Contractor Services. (OCT 2010). This clause applies if services provided by Seller have been determined to be "essential contractor services in support of mission-essential functions," and are listed in the attachment referenced in paragraph (b) of the clause. In paragraph (c)(2), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. In paragraph (c)(3) "Contracting Officer" shall mean the Contracting Officer or Buyer. In paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. In paragraph (f), ninety days is replaced with sixty days. In paragraph (g), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer.

252.244-7000 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (JUN 2013).

252.246-7003 Notification of Potential Safety Issues (JUN 2013). This clause applies only if this subcontract is for: (i) parts identified as critical safety items; (ii) systems and subsystems, assemblies and subassemblies integral to a system; or (iii) repair, maintenance, logistics support, or overhaul services for systems and subsystems, assemblies, subassemblies and parts integral to a system. The notification required by paragraph (c) of this clause will be provided to Buyer and to the administrative contracting officer (ACO) and the procuring contracting officer (PCO) if Seller is aware of the ACO and PCO for the prime contract.

252.247-7003 Pass-Through of Motor Carrier Fuel Surcharge Adjustment to the Cost Bearer (JUN 2013). This clause applies if this contract is with a motor carrier, broker, or freight forwarder.

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea-Basic (APR 2014). This clause applies if this contract is for supplies that are of a type described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (d), "45 days" is changed to "60 days." If this contract exceeds the

simplified acquisition threshold, paragraphs (a)-(h) apply. In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer. If this contract is at or below the simplified acquisition threshold, paragraphs (f) and (g) are excluded.

52.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). Contracting Officer and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), Contractor mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.

3. Commercial Items If goods or services being procured under this contract are commercial items and Clause H203 is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:

52.203-13 Contractor Code of Business Ethics and Conduct (OCT 2015). This clause applies only if this contract is in excess of \$5,500,000 and has a period of performance of more than 120 days.

52.203-15 Whistleblower Protections Under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (JUN 2010). This clause applies if this contract is funded in whole or in part with Recovery Act funds.

52.204-21 Basic Safeguarding of Covered Information Systems (JUN 2016).

52.209-6 Protecting the Government's Interests When Subcontracting With Contractors Debarred, Suspended or Proposed for Debarment (OCT 2015). Seller agrees it is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. Seller shall disclose to Buyer, in writing, whether as of the time of award of this contract, Seller or its principals is or is not debarred, suspended, or proposed for debarment by the Federal Government. This clause does not apply to contracts where Seller is providing commercially available off-the shelf items.

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (NOV 2016).

52.222-17 Nondisplacement of Qualified Workers (MAY 2014). The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer" in paragraph (d)(1). In paragraph (d)(1), "30 days" is changed to "40 days" and "10 days" is changed to "15 days."

52.222-21 Prohibition of Segregated Facilities (APR 2015).

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (SEP 2016).

52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Veterans. (OCT 2015). This clause applies only if this contract is \$150,000 or more.

52.222-36 Equal Opportunity for Workers with Disabilities (JUL 2014). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$15,000.

52.222-37 Employment Reports on Veterans (FEB 2016). This clause applies if the Contract is \$150,000 or more.

52.222-40 Notification of Employee Rights Under the National Labor Relations Act. (DEC 2010).

52.222-41 Service Contract Labor Standards (MAY 2014). This clause applies only if this contract is subject to the Act. Where applicable, Wage Determination(s) shall be attached to the purchase contract at the time of award, or furnished upon request.

52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons (MAR 2015). The term "contractor" shall mean "Seller", except in the paragraph (a) definition of Agent, and except when the term "prime contractor" appears, which shall remain unchanged. The term "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer, Buyer's Authorized Procurement representative" in paragraph (d)(1). Paragraph (d)(2) shall read as follows: "If the allegation may be associated with more than one contract, the Seller shall inform the Buyer's Authorized Procurement Representative for each affected contract." The term "the Government" shall mean "the Government and Buyer" in paragraph (e). The term "termination" shall mean "Cancellation" and "Cancellation for Default", respectively, in paragraph (e)(6). The

term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer and Buyer” in paragraph (f), except in paragraph (f)(2), where it shall mean “Contracting Officer or Buyer”. Paragraph (h)(2)(ii) shall read as follows: “To the nature and scope of the activities involved in the performance of a Government subcontract, including the number of non-United States citizens expected to be employed and the risk that the contract or subcontract will involve services or supplies susceptible to trafficking in persons.” The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer or Buyer” in paragraph (h)(4)(ii). The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Buyer” in paragraph (h)(5).

52.222-50 Combating Trafficking in Persons Alternate I (MAR 2015). The term “Contractor” shall mean “Seller”, except the term “prime contractor” shall remain unchanged. The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer and the Buyer’s Authorized Procurement representative in paragraph (d)(1). Paragraph (d)(2) shall read as follows: “If the allegation may be associated with more than one contract, the Seller shall inform the Buyer’s Authorized Procurement Representative for each affected contract.” The term “the Government” shall mean “the Government and Buyer” in paragraph (e). The term “termination” shall mean “cancellation” and “Cancellation for Default”, respectively, in paragraph (e)(6). Insert the following at the end of paragraph (e): “If the Government exercises one of the remedies identified in the paragraph (e) against Buyer as a result, in whole or in part, of the Seller’s violation of its obligations under this clause, Buyer may impose that remedy against the Seller proportionate to the extent to which Seller’s violation caused the Government’s decision to impose a remedy on Buyer.” The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer and Buyer” in paragraph (f), except in paragraph (f)(2), where it shall mean “Contracting Officer or Buyer”. Paragraph (h)(2)(ii) shall read as follows: “To the nature and scope of the activities involved in the performance of a Government subcontract, including the number of non-United States citizens expected to be employed and the risk that the contract or subcontract will involve services or supplies susceptible to trafficking in persons.” The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Contracting Officer or Buyer” in paragraph (h)(4)(ii). The term “Contracting Officer” shall mean “Buyer” in paragraph (h)(5).

52.222-53 Exemption From Application Of The Service Contract Labor Standards To Contracts For Certain Services-Requirements (MAY 2014). This clause applies to contracts for exempt services.

52.222-54 Employment Eligibility Verification (OCT 2015). This clause applies to all subcontracts that (1) are for (i) commercial or noncommercial services (except for commercial services that are part of the purchase of a COTS item, or an item that would be a COTS item, but for minor modifications performed by the COTS provider and are normally provided for that COTS item), or (ii) construction; (2) has a value of more than \$3,500; and (3) includes work performed in the United States.

52.222-55 Minimum Wages Under Executive Order 13658 (DEC 2015). This clause applies if this contract is subject to the Service Contract Labor Standards statute or the Wage Rate Requirements (Construction) statute, and is to be performed in whole or in part in the United States. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer" except for paragraphs (e)(2), (4) and (g). If the Government exercises a withhold identified in the paragraph (g) against Buyer as a result of the Seller’s violation of its obligations under this clause, Buyer may impose that withhold against the Seller.

52.222-60 Paycheck Transparency (Executive Order 13673) (OCT 2016). This clause applies if the Contract exceeds \$500,000 and the contract is not for commercially available off-the-shelf items.

52.225-26 Contractors Performing Private Security Functions Outside the United States (OCT 2016). This clause applies if the Contract will be performed outside the United States in areas of (1) combat operations, as designated by the Secretary of Defense; or (2) other significant military operations, upon agreement of the Secretaries of Defense and State that the clause applies in that area. In paragraph (d)(1), Contracting Officer shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer" and in paragraph (d) (3), Contracting Officer shall mean Buyer.

52.226-6 Promoting Excess Food Donation to Nonprofit Organizations. (MAY 2014). This clause applies if this contract is in excess of \$25,000 and Seller will perform the provision, service, or sale of food in the United States under this contract.

52.232-40 Providing Accelerated Payments to Small Business Subcontractors. (DEC 2013). This clause applies to contracts with small business concerns. The term "Contractor" retains its original meaning.

52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (NOV 2016). Clauses in paragraph (c) (1) are applicable to Seller for commercial items ordered by Buyer from Seller under this contract.

52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels (FEB 2006). This clause does not apply if this contract

is for the acquisition of commercial items unless (i) this contract is a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) items the Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Seller does not add value to the items when it subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b) shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.

252.203-7002 REQUIREMENT TO INFORM EMPLOYEES OF WHISTLEBLOWER RIGHTS (SEP 2013).

252.211-7003 Item Unique Identification and Valuation (MAR 2016). This clause applies if this contract acquires any item for which unique item identification is required in accordance with paragraph (c) (1) of this clause. Items subject to the requirements of DFARS 252.211-7003, if any, shall be identified in an exhibit in this contract.

252.211-7006 Radio Frequency Identification (JUN 2016). This clause applies when the Seller will make direct shipments of items meeting the criteria at 211.275-2 to the Government.

252.225-7001 Buy American and Balance of Payments Program (AUG 2016). In paragraph (c), the phrase "in the Buy American Balance of Payments Program Certificate provision of the solicitation" is deleted and the word "certified" is deleted and replaced with the word "specified."

252.225-7009 Restriction on Acquisition of Certain Articles Containing Specialty Metals (OCT 2014). Paragraph (d) and (e)(1) of this clause is excluded. Paragraph (e) of this clause is included wherein "Government" means Buyer.

252.225-7012 Preference for Certain Domestic Commodities (AUG 2016).

252.225-7039 Defense Contractors Performing Private Security Functions Outside the United States (JUN 2016). This clause applies if the contract requires that private security functions will be performed outside the United States in areas of (1) contingency operations; (2) combat operations, as designated by the Secretary of Defense; (3) other significant military operations (as defined in 32 CFR part 159), designated by the Secretary of Defense upon agreement of the Secretary of State; (4) peace operations, consistent with Joint Publication 3-07.3; or (5) other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander.

252.225-7040 Contractor Personnel Supporting U.S. Armed Forces Deployed Outside the United States (OCT 2015). This clause, including this paragraph (q), applies if, in performance of this contract, Seller personnel are supporting U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States in (1) contingency operations; (2) peace operations consistent with Joint Publication 3-07.3; or (3) other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander or as directed by the Secretary of Defense.

252.227-7015 Technical Data -- Commercial Items (FEB 2014). This clause applies whenever any technical data related to commercial items is developed in any part at private expense and will be obtained from Seller or its subcontractors for delivery to the Government.

252.227-7037 Validation of Restrictive Markings on Technical Data (SEP 2016).

252.236-7013 Requirement for Competition Opportunity for American Steel Producers, Fabricators, and Manufacturers (JUN 2013). This clause applies if this contract involves the acquisition of steel as a construction material.

252.237-7010 Prohibition on Interrogation of Detainees by Contractor Personnel (JUN 2013). This clause applies if the contract requires Seller's personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

252.237-7019 Training for Contractor Personnel Interacting with Detainees (JUN 2013). This clause applies if the Contract may require Seller personnel to interact with detainees in the course of their duties.

252.244-7000 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (JUN 2013).

252.246-7003 Notification of Potential Safety Issues (JUN 2013). This clause applies only if this subcontract is for: (i) parts identified as critical safety items; (ii) systems and subsystems, assemblies and subassemblies integral to a system; or (iii) repair, maintenance, logistics support, or overhaul services for systems and subsystems, assemblies, subassemblies and parts integral to a system. The notification required by paragraph (c) of this clause will be provided to Buyer and to the administrative contracting officer (ACO) and the procuring contracting officer (PCO) if Seller is aware of the ACO and PCO for the prime contract.

252.247-7003 Pass-Through of Motor Carrier Fuel Surcharge Adjustment to the Cost Bearer (JUN 2013).

This clause applies if this contract is with a motor carrier, broker, or freight forwarder.

252.247-7023 Transportation of Supplies by Sea-Basic (APR 2014). This clause applies if this contract is for supplies that are of a type described in paragraph (b)(2) of this clause. In paragraph (d), "45 days" is changed to "60 days." If this contract exceeds the simplified acquisition threshold, paragraphs (a)-(h) apply. In paragraph (g) "Government" means Buyer. If this contract is at or below the simplified acquisition threshold, paragraphs (f) and (g) are excluded.

252.247-7024 Notification of Transportation of Supplies by Sea (MAR 2000). Contracting Officer and, in the first sentence of paragraph (a), Contractor mean Buyer. This clause applies only if the supplies being transported are noncommercial items or commercial items that (i) Seller is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, Seller does not add value to items that it contracts for f.o.b. destination shipment); (ii) are shipped in direct support of U.S. military contingency operations, exercises, or forces deployed in humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or (iii) are commissary or exchange cargoes transported outside the Defense Transportation System in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2643.
