CUSTOMER CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

If Form GP1 is applicable to this procurement, this Attachment constitutes the Government clauses contemplated by Article 29. If Form GP2 is applicable to this procurement, this Attachment constitutes the Government clauses contemplated by Article 28. If Form GP3 is applicable to this procurement, this Attachment constitutes the Government clauses contemplated by Article 41. If Form GP4 is applicable to this procurement, this Attachment constitutes the Government clauses contemplated by Article 31. If this contract is for the procurement of commercial items, as defined in FAR Part 2.101, see Section 3 below.

1. The following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the Federal Acquisition Regulation and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller.

52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures (excluding subparagraph (c)(1)) (JUL 1995). Buyer may withhold sums owed Seller the amount of any kickback paid by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier if (a) the Contracting Officer so directs, or (b) the Contracting Officer has offset the amount of such kickback against money owed Buyer under the prime contract. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.203-10 Price or Fee Adjustment for Illegal or Improper Activity (JAN 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. If the Government reduces Buyer's price or fee for violations of the Act by Seller or its subcontractors at any tier, Buyer may withhold from sums owed Seller the amount of the reduction.

52.203-11 Certification and Disclosure Regarding Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (APR 1991). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.203-12 Limitation on Payments to Influence Certain Federal Transactions (JAN 1990). This clause applies only if this Contract exceeds \$100,000. Paragraph (c)(4) is modified to read as follows: "(c)(4) Seller will promptly submit any disclosure required (with written notice to Boeing) directly to the PCO for the prime contract. Boeing will identify the cognizant Government PCO at Seller's request. Each subcontractor certification will be retained in the subcontract file of the awarding contractor.

52.211-15 Defense Priority and Allocation Requirements (SEP 1990). This clause is applicable if a priority rating is noted in this contract.

52.215-2 Audit and Records - Negotiation (AUG 1996). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000 and (i) is cost-reimbursement, incentive, time-and-materials, labor-hour, or price-redeterminable type or any combination of these types: (ii) Seller was required to provide cost or pricing data, or (iii) Seller is required to furnish reports as discussed in paragraph (e) of the referenced clause.

52.215-10 Price Reduction For Defective Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and is not otherwise exempt. In subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a), insert "of this contract" after "price or cost." In Paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Paragraphs (c)(1), (c)(1)(ii), and (c)(2)(i), "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Contracting Officer or Buyer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(i)(A), delete "to the Contracting Officer." In Subparagraph (c)(2)(ii)(B), "Government" shall mean "Government or Buyer." In Paragraph (d), "United States" shall mean "United States or Buyer."

52.215-12 Subcontractor Cost or Pricing Data (OCT 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$550,000 and is not otherwise exempt. The certificate required by paragraph (b) of the referenced clause shall

be modified as follows: delete "to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's representative" and substitute in lieu thereof "The Boeing Company or any of its wholly owned subsidiaries."

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (OCT 1995).

52.219-9 Small Business Subcontracting Plan (AUG 1996). In paragraph (c), "Contracting Officer" shall mean Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$500,000. and Seller is not a small business concern.

52.222-4 Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act — Overtime Compensation (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. Buyer may withhold or recover from Seller the amount of any sums the Contracting Officer withholds or recovers from Buyer because of liabilities of Seller or its subcontractors under this clause.

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b)(1) through (11)) (APR 1984).

52.222-35 Equal Opportunity for Special Disabled, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.

52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Workers With Disabilities (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$ 2,500.

52.222-37 Employment Reports on Special Disabled Veterans, Veterans of the Vietnam Era, and Other Eligible Veterans (JAN 1988). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.

52.223-2 Clean Air & Water (APR 1984). This clause applies only if order exceeds \$100,000.

52.225-10 Duty-free Entry (APR 1984). This clause applies only if this contract identifies supplies to be afforded duty-free entry or if foreign supplies in excess of \$10,000 may be imported into the customs territory of the United States. For the purposes of this clause, the blanks in paragraph (g)(3) are completed as follows: UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT, DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE, Duty-free entry is claimed pursuant Section XXII, Chapter 98, Subchapter VIII, Item No. 9808.00.30 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States. Upon arrival of shipment at port of entry, the importer or authorized agent will notify Commander, Defense Contract Management Area Operations (DCMAO, New York, 201 Varick Street, New York, New York, 10014-4811, Attention DCRN-NCT) for execution of Customs Forms 7501, 7501-A, or 7506 and required duty free entry certificates.

52.225-11 Restrictions on Certain Foreign Purchases (OCT 1996).

52.227-1 Authorization and Consent (JUL 1995).

52.227-2 Notice and Assistance Regarding Patent and Copyright Infringement (AUG 1996). A copy of each notice sent to the Government will be sent to Buyer. "Contracting Officer" shall mean "Buyer". This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000.

52.227-14 Rights in Data — General (JUN 1987), as modified by NASA FAR Sup. 18-52.227-14. This clause applies only if data will be produced, furnished or acquired under this contract.

52.227-16 Additional Data Requirements (JUN 1987). This clause applies only if this contract involves experimental, developmental, research, or demonstration work.

52.228-5 Insurance - Work on a Government Installation (SEP 1989). Seller shall provide and maintain insurance as set forth in this contract.

52.230-6 Administration of Cost Accounting Standards (APR 1996). Add "Buyer and the" before "Contracting Officer in paragraph (f). This provision applies if Clause H002 is included in Buyer's contract.

52.244-5 Competition in Subcontracting (DEC 1996)

52.244-6 Subcontracts for Commercial Items (OCT 1998)

52.245-2 Government Property (Fixed Price Contracts) (DEC 1989). This clause is not applicable if this contract incorporates Form GP4. "Government" shall mean Government throughout except the first time it appears in paragraph (f) when "Government" shall mean the Government or the Buyer.

52.247-63 Preference for U.S.-Flag Air Carriers (JAN 1997). This clause only applies if this contract involves international air transportation.

52.248-1 Value Engineering (excluding subparagraph (f)) (MAR 1989). The term "Contracting Officer" means Buyer. This clause applies only if this contract is for \$100,000 or more. If Value Engineering Change Proposal is accepted by the Government, Seller's share will be 50% of the instant, concurrent and future contract net acquisition savings and collateral savings that Buyer receives from the Government. Seller's negotiated share of the net acquisition savings and collateral savings shall not reduce the Government's share of concurrent or future savings or collateral savings. Buyer's payments to Seller under this clause are conditioned upon Buyer's receipt of authorization for such payments from the Government.

2. NASA Contracts. If this contract is placed under a National Aeronautics and Space Administration contract, the following contract clauses are incorporated by reference from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement and apply to the extent indicated. In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" means Seller. Unless otherwise provided, the clauses are those in effect as of the date of this contract.

18-52.208-81 Restrictions on Printing and Duplicating (AUG 1993).

18-52.211-70 Packaging, Handling, and Transportation (JUN 2000).

18-52.223-70 Safety and Health (MAR 1997). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$1,000,000 or construction, repairs or alteration in excess of \$100,000, or it involve the use of hazardous materials or operations.

18-52.223-71 Frequency Authorization (DEC 1988). This clause applies only if this contract requires the development, production, construction, testing or operation of a device for which a radio frequency authorization is required.

18-52.227-14 Rights in Data — General. This clause applies only if data will be produced, furnished or acquired under this contract except contracts for basic or applied research with universities or colleges.

18-52.244-70 Geographic Participation in the Aerospace Program (APR 1985). This clause applies only if this contract is for \$100,000 or more.

3. If goods or services being procured under this contract are for commercial items and [Clause H203](#) is set forth in the purchase order, the foregoing Government clauses in Sections 1 and 2 above are deleted and the following FAR/DFARS clauses are inserted in lieu thereof:

52.219-8 Utilization of Small Business Concerns (OCT 2000). Include in all subcontracts that offer further subcontracting opportunities. If a subcontract (except subcontracts to small business concerns) exceeds \$500,000 (\$1,000,000 for construction of any public facility), Seller and any lower tier subcontractor must include 52.219-8 in lower tier subcontracts that offer subcontracting opportunities.

52.222-26 Equal Opportunity (subparagraph (b)(1) through (11)) (APR 2002).

52.222-35 Affirmative Action for Special Disabled and Vietnam Era Veterans (Dec 2001). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$25,000.

52.222-36 Affirmative Action for Handicapped Workers (JUN 1998). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$10,000.

52.247-64 Preference for Privately Owned U.S.-Flag Commercial Vessels (APR 2003). This clause only applies if this contract is (i) a contract or agreement for ocean transportation services; or a construction contract; or (ii) the supplies being transported are (a) Items the Contractor is reselling or distributing to the Government without adding value (generally, the Contractor does not add value to the items when it subcontracts items for f.o.b. destination shipment); or (b) shipped in direct support of U.S. military (1) contingency operations; (2) exercises; or (3) forces deployed in connection with United Nations or North Atlantic Treaty Organization humanitarian or peacekeeping operations.

4. Cost Accounting Standards

(1) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H001). The version of FAR 52.230-2, Cost Accounting Standards, incorporated by clause H001 is the version dated APR 1996.

(2) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H002). The version of FAR 52.230-3, Disclosure and Consistency of Cost Accounting Practices, incorporated by clause H002 is the version dated APR 1996

(3) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H003). The version of FAR 52.230-4, Consistency in Cost Accounting Practices, incorporated by clause H003 is the version dated AUG 1992.

(4) (Applicable if this contract incorporates clause H004). The version of FAR 52.230-5, Cost Accounting Standards – Educational Institution, incorporated by clause H004 is the version dated APR 1996.

5. The following prime contract special provisions apply to this purchase order:

A. NOTIFICATION OF DEBARMENT/SUSPENSION STATUS

Seller shall provide immediate notice to Buyer in the event of being suspended, debarred or declared ineligible by any Department or other Federal Agency, or upon receipt of a notice of proposed debarment from any DoD Agency, during the performance of this Contract.

B. EXPORT CONTROLLED DATA RESTRICTIONS

(1) For the purpose of this clause,

(A) Foreign person is any person who is not a citizen of the U.S. or lawfully admitted to the U.S. for permanent residence under the Immigration and Nationality Act, and includes foreign corporations, foreign organizations, and foreign governments;

(B) Foreign representative is anyone, regardless of nationality or citizenship, acting as an agent, representative, official, or employee of a foreign government, a foreign-owned or influenced firm, corporation, or person; and

(C) Foreign sources are those sources (vendors, subcontractors, and suppliers) owned and controlled by a foreign person.

(2) Seller shall place a clause in subcontracts containing appropriate export control restrictions, set forth in this clause.

(3) Nothing in this clause waives any requirement imposed by any other U.S. Government agency with respect to employment of foreign nationals or export-controlled data and information.

(4) Equipment and technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract are controlled by the International Traffic in Arms Regulation (ITAR), 22 CFR Sections 121 through 128. An export

license is required before assigning any foreign source to perform work under this contract or before granting access to foreign persons to any equipment and technical data generated or delivered during performance (see 22 CFR Section 125). Seller shall notify Buyer and obtain the written approval of Buyer prior to assigning or granting access to any work, equipment, or technical data generated or delivered in the performance of this contract to foreign persons or their representatives. This notification shall include the name and country of origin of the foreign person or representative, the specific work, equipment, or data to which the person will have access, and whether the foreign person is cleared to have access to technical data (DoD 5220.22-M, National Industrial Security Program Operating Manual (NISPOM)).

C. CROSS WAIVER OF LIABILITY

- (1) For purposes of this clause: "related entity" means a contractor or subcontractor at any tier; "damage" means bodily injury to or death of any person, damage to or loss of any property, loss of revenue or profits, or other direct, indirect or consequential damage; "payload" means all property to be flown or used on or in a launch vehicle, or any part thereof; "protected space operations" means all launch-vehicle and payload activities on Earth, in outer space, or in transit between Earth and outer space, including but limited to: research, design, development, test, manufacture, assembly, integration, operation, or use of launch vehicles, payloads and related support equipment and services; and all activities related to ground support, test, training, simulation or guidance and control equipment, and related facilities and services.
- (2) Each party agrees to a cross-waiver of liability pursuant to which each party waives all claims against any of the entities or persons involved in the performance of this order, Buyer's prime contract, or other Sellers in the performance of orders under Buyer's prime contract. This cross-waiver shall apply only if the person, entity or property causing the damage is involved in protected space operations and the person, entity or property damaged is damaged by virtue of its involvement in protected space operations. The cross-waiver shall apply to any claims for damage, whatever the legal basis for such claims, including but not limited to delict and tort (including negligence of every degree and kind) and contract, against: another party; a related entity of another party; the employees of any party or its related entities.
- (3) In addition, each party shall extend the cross-waiver of liability as set forth above to its own related entities by requiring them to agree to waive all claims against parties or persons identified above.
- (4) For avoidance of doubt, this cross-waiver of liability includes a cross-waiver of liability arising from the Convention on International Liability for Damage by Space Objects (MAR 29, 1972, 24 U.S.T. 2389, Treaties and Other International Acts Series (T.I.A.S. No. 7762) where the person, entity or property damaged is damaged by virtue of its involvement in protected space operations.
- (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of this clause, the cross-waiver of liability shall not be applicable to: claims between a party and its own related entity or between its own related entities; claims made by a natural person, his or her estate, survivors or subrogees for injury or death of such natural person; claims for damage for damage caused by willful misconduct; intellectual property claims; contract claims between parties based on the express contractual provisions of this order, except for this cross-waiver of liability clause.
- (6) Nothing in this clause shall be construed to create the basis for a claim or suit where none would otherwise exist.
